



Entry requirements for Canada have changed Find out if they apply to your clients

In addition to a valid passport, they will also need:

- > a valid **Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA)***, or;
- > a valid visa, or;
- > a valid Permanent Resident Card (PRC)

*Holders of a valid Canadian passport, Canadian Permanent Resident Card (PRC) or Canadian visa, as well as U.S. citizens, are ineligible for an eTA and must present their original documents for travel.

Canadian citizens and dual Canadian citizens

Canadian citizens, including dual Canadian citizens, need to show proof that they are Canadian to board their flight to Canada. A valid Canadian passport is the only reliable and universally accepted travel and identification document available to Canadians for the purpose of international air travel.

Dual Canadian citizens used to travelling to or transiting through Canada by air with a non-Canadian passport will no longer be able to do so. They will need a valid Canadian passport to board your flight. Find out how to apply for or renew a passport at Canada.ca/passport.

Canadian permanent residents

Canadian permanent residents must present a valid Canadian Permanent Resident Card (PRC) or Permanent Resident Travel Document (PRTD), as well as a valid passport, to board a flight to Canada. Learn more about travelling as a Canadian permanent resident at Canada.ca/PR-card.
