GOOD TO KNOW

Currency and money exchange

The local currency is the Euro (€). Exchange desks can be found in your hotel. Banks and exchange offices are located throughout your destination. Bank hours are Monday to Thursday, 8:00 am to 2:30 pm; Friday, 8:00 am to 2:00 pm; Saturday and Sunday, closed. Branches of the National Bank in Athens can be found at Syntagma Square and Omonia Square. They are open from Monday to Friday, 8:00 am to 6:30 pm. ATMs can be found throughout Athens.

Tipping

Tipping is at your discretion, but customary. Excursion guides and drivers: It is customary to tip and we recommend about €4 to 6 per person/day to cover both. **Restaurants:** 10 to 15% will be added to your bill but may not make its way to the serving staff, so you might wish to leave another 5 to 10% in cash on the table.

Telephone

Direct calls can be made from your hotel room. Local phone booths take calling cards that you may purchase from hotel shops and kiosks. These cards are valid for local and overseas calls, cost about €5 and last approximately 3 to 5 minutes. The actual duration of any card varies according to the issuing company. Please inform yourself accordingly.

Taxis

All taxis in Athens work on metres. The metre starts at approximately €1.30 and there are two fares:

Zone 1 5:00 am to midnight
Zone 2 Midnight to 5:00 am

Minimum fare approx. €3.50

Always make sure metre is turned on before proceeding with your journey.

Tram and metro in Athens

The tram and metro features three lines: the **Red Line** (Anthoupoli-Elliniko), the **Blue Line** (Agia Marina-Athens Airport) and the **Green Line** (Piraeus-Kifissia). The price of a one-way fare is approximately €1.40, but you can purchase a one-day pass for around €4. The city is linked to the coast by a 28.9 km tramway line that provides easy access to Faliro, Alimos and Glyfada.

Bargaining in bazaars

In the bazaars of Turkey, the social ritual of bargaining is the rule.

Begin by offering about 60% of the asking price and be prepared to go up to about 70 to 75%. You may need to leave in order to bring down the price, and never let anyone know how much you like something. It's great fun once you get the hang of it and a smile goes a long way!

Food and drink in Greece

Ouzo, a licorice-flavoured spirit, is the traditional aperitif. Tasty wines are found just about everywhere (the rugged **Retsina**, however, is an acquired taste). The best known appetizers are **taramosalata**, a delicious fish roe spread, **tzatziki** (yogurt with cucumber and garlic) and **melitzanosalata** (eggplant and garlic dip). Seafood is very popular here; fish can be chosen personally and will be gladly trotted out for inspection. The most popular meat courses include **arnaki** (lamb), **gourounopoulo** (suckling pig) and **souvlaki** (meat kebabs grilled on a skewer). For those with a sweet tooth, dessert shops feature pastries, cookies, ice cream, chocolate and sticky flaky filo pastry filled with honey and nuts, known as **baklava** and **kataifi**.

Excursion advice

Destinations and excursions contained in this pamphlet are for information purposes only. In all cases, comfortable, non-slip walking shoes, a sun hat and bottled water are recommended. **Religious sites, such as monasteries and the like, have appropriate dress codes.** Bare shoulders and knees are not permitted (a light covering for bare arms is advised), as well as shorts of any kind. In some instances, excursions are not suited to elderly persons or those with restricted mobility.

Scheduling of excursions

All tours depart from and return to the hotel and/or pier adjacent to the ship's berth. Please book your tours with your Transat representatives. Should you choose to leave the tour en route, it will be your responsibility to secure transportation back to your hotel or ship. **Passengers should be on board the ship no later than 30 minutes prior to the scheduled sailing time.** The ship's departure cannot be delayed for late-returning passengers.





DESTINATIONS

GREECE

Athens

Majestic & Modern Everywhere you turn in Athens, you will be awestruck by the way the past and the present work together to create a city that is alive, bustling and exciting. Athens, the capital city of Greece once thought to be protected by the goddess Athena, remains a magical, romantic place.

Crete

A Wondrous Isle Zeus and his son Minos, legendary king of Crete, both sprung from this marvelous place. The ecosystem of Crete is unique, encompassing varied flora as well as animal species found only on this island. Vacationers adore its boundless beaches, numerous tavernas and fascinating museums, and the more adventurous will try raki, a strong spirit made from grape must.

Ionian Islands

Mykonos

The characteristic, dazzlingly white cube-shaped houses contrast strikingly with the intense blue and green of their wooden doors and shutters. Little winding streets, windmills and smooth sand beaches complete the picture of the perfect island paradise.

Nafplio

A Must for Romantic Getaways Nestled in the eastern part of the Peloponnese peninsula, this seaport town's charming narrow streets and unparalleled landscapes will leave you in awe. Once considered the capital of Greece, this picture-perfect gem is rich in Venetian and neoclassical buildings, fortresses and medieval castles.

Naxos

The Greenest Isle Naxos, the largest of the Cyclades islands, has all the wonderful features of some of Greece's most popular destinations, plus even more culture, history and living traditions. It remains relatively quiet, without the crowds some of the other islands experience during high season. This Mediterranean paradise has been inhabited since 3,000 BC, ruled by a number of different occupying forces, including the Venetians and the Ottoman Empire, making it an exceptionally rich source of archaeological, architectural and cultural artefacts.

Paros, Ios, Milos, Folegandros & Syros

The Wonderful Cyclades Well-known for its nightlife, visitors to Ios bask in a festive atmosphere, as evident on the island's golden beaches as it is in the nightclubs and open-air tavernas. Picturesque Paros abounds in pretty coves, miniature churches, narrow cobblestone streets and Byzantine monuments. Featuring a volcanic landscape, some of the most colourful beaches in the Aegean and picturesque villages, Milos is a very sought after vacation destination. Located nearby, the tiny island of Folegandros blends together all the ingredients for a relaxing getaway: breathtaking landscapes, stunning beaches, traditional villages and mouth-watering food.

Patmos & Rhodes

The Mythic & the Colossus Patmos, where John of Patmos wrote Revelations, is a key Christian pilgrimage site and a very pleasant place to visit. Majestic Rhodes, whose port was once guarded by the Colossus, one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World, offers a cosmopolitan atmosphere enriched by an astonishing blend of ancient and modern.

Santorini

Rejuvenates the Soul It is what many of us envision when we dream of Greece, and this fashionable island frequently surpasses the fantasy. Days give way to nights of dramatic sunsets enjoyed from pleasant open-air cafés. Few sights are more memorable than the dazzling whitewashed buildings that sit perched on the rim of black volcanic cliffs.

EXCURSIONS

ATHENS

Athens One-Day Cruise

Full day (including lunch)



This classic **one-day cruise** takes you to the three enchanting islands of Aegina, Poros and Hydra. Enjoy the marvelous Mediterranean atmosphere as you visit the intriguing historic sites of the Saronic Gulf and sample traditional Greek food while listening to delightful folk music.

Argolis Tour

Full day (including lunch)



Travel on the coastal road along the Saronic Gulf to the Corinth Canal, before driving to Mycenae and the Homeric city of Atreides, the city "rich in gold" of the ancient poets. Visit the Lion's Gate, the Cyclopean Walls, the Royal Tombs, etc. Then, depart for Nafplio, a picturesque town nestled at the foot of a cliff crowned by the mighty ramparts of the Palamidi Fortress (short photo stop). Leave for Epidaurus to visit the Theatre (4th century BC), famous for its astonishing acoustics. Return to Athens by taking the national road connecting Epidaurus with Mycenae.

Also available from the Kinetta Beach Resort & Spa on Saturdays.

Athens, the Acropolis & the Acropolis Museum

Half day (morning)



See the Panathenaic Stadium, the Presidential Residence, the Temple of Olympian Zeus, Hadrian's Arch, the Parliament, the Memorial to the Unknown Soldier, the Academy, the University, the National Library and Constitution Square (Syntagma). Stop at the Acropolis and admire the Propylaea, the Temple of Athena Nike, the Erechtheion and the Parthenon. Finally, visit the Acropolis Museum and discover the wonders of the classical era.

Due to certain visiting hour restrictions at the Acropolis Museum, the order of the program may be changed.

Cape Sounion

Half day (afternoon)



Drive along the coastal road, past the wonderful beaches of Glyfada, Vouliagmeni and Varkiza to the southernmost point of Attica, Cape Sounion, where the white marble pillars of the Temple of Poseidon stand. On the way, you will have a splendid view of the Saronic Gulf and the small, offshore islands. After visiting the Temple of Poseidon, you will have time at leisure to walk along Sounion's rocky promontory.

EXCURSIONS

ATHENS

One-Day Cruise to Hydra – Poros – Aegina

Full day



Begin your journey by bus to the port by embarking aboard a cruise boat. Sail 45 minutes to Poros and the seashore of the Peloponnese. Depart for Hydra, where you will have free time to walk or swim (1.5 hours), followed by lunch, which will be served during the voyage. Reach Aegina where you will have time for a swim. Optional bus excursions to the well-preserved Temple of Afea Athena are also available. Return to the port, where you will arrive in the late afternoon.

Also available from the Kinetta Beach Resort & Spa. This cruise is available on Thursdays and the order of islands is subject to change.

Crossing Corinth Canal

Half day



Your breathtaking tour of the famous Corinth Canal, which separates the mainland from the Peloponnese and joins the Aegean Sea and the Ionian Sea, begins by crossing the passage by boat from Kinetta Beach Resort & Spa. The canal is 6 km long and 24.6 m in width. On the way back, again by crossing the canal, you will have the opportunity to savour the local traditional aperitif, Ouzo, accompanied by a meze.

Delphi

Full day (including lunch)



Enjoy a scenic drive to Delphi via the picturesque mountain village of Arachova before arriving at the legendary Castalian Springs. From here, walk a few minutes to the archaeological site of Delphi, where you will visit the Temple of Apollo, the ruins of the Senate of the Delphi Oracle and the Delphi Museum.

Delphi & Meteora

2 days (including breakfast and dinner)



Day 1 Leave for Delphi via Thebes, Lebadia and the picturesque village of Arachova. Upon arrival in Delphi, visit the archaeological site. Continue on to Kalambaka and overnight.

Day 2 Visit Meteora and two of its ancient monasteries, then head back to Athens via Trikala, Lamia and Thermopylae.

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EXCURSIONS

CRETE

Elounda & Spinalonga

Full day (including dinner)



Visitors to Spinalonga are invariably enthralled by its uniqueness. Once you arrive in the fishing village of Elounda, board a "caiique" and sail to the Island of Spinalonga, a leper colony until 1957. Today, visitors can see the ruins of many small houses and businesses built by the lepers, as well as grand Venetian fortresses, houses and well-preserved churches. A truly magical and idyllic day for the whole family.

Entrance fee to Spinalonga not included.

Knossos & Heraklion

Half day



The British archaeologist Sir Arthur Evans excavated Knossos in the late 19th century. Visitors to Knossos Palace will see the earliest European wooden throne in the King's Chamber, huge urns used to store olive oil and grain in the courtyards as well as the highly colourful frescoes. After the Parthenon, Knossos is the second most visited site in Greece. The ruins of the ancient cities of Knossos, Phaistos and Malia demonstrate the incredible wealth and sophistication enjoyed by the Minoan civilization. Also visit Heraklion and see the Church of St. Titus, the Lotzia and the Church of St. Mark.

Entrance fee to the museum not included.

Jeep Safari

Full day



Satisfy your craving for adventure as you follow your guide on your own 4x4 and discover the soul of Crete. Your excursion will take you along picturesque roads between sea and mountain and through hidden Cretan villages.

FOLEGANDROS

Folegandros Boat Tour

6 hours (including lunch)



Sail away for a full-day sea excursion that takes you to five of the island's most beautiful beaches. Each stop lasts between half an hour to one hour, so you will have plenty of time to swim and relax. At one of the stops, you will be served a light lunch with Cretan raki on board. This very popular excursion is the most relaxing way to explore the island.

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EXCURSIONS

MILOS

Traditional "Trehantiri" Sea Excursion

Full day



Enjoy a thrilling day on a traditional trehantiri, a wooden sailboat used for fishing and transporting cargo. Along the way, admire the stunning scenery and picturesque fishing villages, before stopping at a beautiful beach on the west coast. Then sail inside Sykia Cave for an unforgettable swim, before continuing on to Kleftiko, a one-time pirate enclave that features a unique volcanic landscape. Go snorkelling in the crystalline waters, then enjoy a sumptuous buffet accompanied by local wines and ice-cold beer. Return to Adamas, with another stop along the way.

Itinerary is subject to change, but always includes a stop at Kleftiko.

Island Tour

Half day



Set off on a walking tour that includes the Old Town, the port and the famous windmills. You might even catch a glimpse of Petros the Pelican, the mascot of Mykonos. Then, travel by bus to the village of Ano Mera, and spend some time exploring the town or visiting the Panagia Tourliani Monastery, which dates back to the 16th century. On to Kalafatis Beach to soak up some sun before heading back to town where you will be treated to an amazing bird's-eye view of your surroundings.

Tuesday, Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday departures.

MYKONOS

Apollo Sanctuary on Delos

4 hours



Visit Delos, the legendary birthplace of the sun god Apollo and his twin sister Artemis. Go on a guided walking tour to see the Agora, the Sacred Way, the Temple of Apollo and the remains of the Hellenistic Quarter that contains the houses of Cleopatra and Dionysos, as well as the ruins of other notable quarters.

This excursion is not recommended for those with reduced mobility.

NAFPLIO

Romantic Nafplio, the First Capital of Greece, Nemea Wine Tasting

Half day



Depart Nafplio for Nemea, home to some of Greece's oldest, biggest and most famous wineries, where red wine is produced using the noble Greek Agiorgitiko grape. After a tasting, return to Nafplio before boarding for free time to explore its highlights. The ancient ramparts, castles, Ottoman fountains, Venetian houses, neoclassical mansions, Archaeological Museum of Nafplio, National Art Gallery's branch in Nafplio, Turkish mosques, Orthodox churches and vibrant Plateia Syntagmatos square are all a sight to behold.

EXCURSIONS

PAROS

Paros Island Tour

Full day



Begin your excursion at Parikia and walk towards the Venetian castle and church of Saint Konstantinos and Eleni, followed by Panagia Ekatonapyliani. From here, you will arrive at the port of Pounta and a ferry will cross to Antiparos where you will visit the inhabited Venetian fortress. From Paros, pass the villages of Alyki and Drios by bus until Pisso Livadi for free time to eat or swim. Admire traditional Cycladic architecture as you reach Lefkes. Continue to Marathi, where marble was mined for famous ancient sculptures (Venus de Milo). In the afternoon, arrive in Naousa, the charming fishing village.

Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday departures.

RHODES

Religious and Medieval Tour – Philerimos Church and the Palace of the Knights*

4 hours



Admire the Acropolis of ancient Rhodes on the hill of St. Stephanos. Wander through the Hellenistic Temple of Apollo's ruins, where below lies the Ancient Stadium of Diagoras. Next, marvel at Philerimos, a popular tourist attraction. Its hill, above the homonymous bay, is one of the three Rhodian cities that participated in the Trojan War and its stone steps lead to the Gothic Monastery of Our Lady of Philerimos. Then, visit the Church of St. George Hostos and discover its rare frescoes. Here, the Golgotha path of 12 copper reliefs depicts the Passion of Christ. Back in Rhodes, stroll the Street of Knights to the Palace of the Grand Master.

PATMOS

Religious Visit to St. John's Monastery – Cave of the Apocalypse*

2 hours



Start your journey in the picturesque alleyways that lead to the Monastery of St. John the Evangelist. The visit opens the doors to the Monastery's yard, where monks have their meals. Of exquisite beauty is the tour of the Byzantine Church of St. John, adorned with a wood-carved icon screen, important frescoes and mosaics. Its small museum hosts religious treasures of inestimable value. Behind the Chapel of St. Anne lies the entrance to the Grotto of the Apocalypse. You will see the cross engraved by St. John the Evangelist and the triple fissure in the wall of the cave, where St. John heard God dictating the Apocalypse to him.

Rhodes Island Tour

Full day



First, stop at the village of Archangelos for a ceramic pottery demonstration before continuing on to the villages of Lindos where you will visit the Acropolis, Apolakkia, Sianna and Embona with a stop at Emery Winery for a wine tasting. Lastly, visit the city of Philerimos (or Butterfly Valley).

Entrance fees to the Acropolis not included.

EXCURSIONS

RHODES

Rhodes & Lindos – Medieval Tour – Acropolis of Lindos and the Citadel of the Knights*

6 hours



Visit Lindos, situated 55 km from the city of Rhodes with the Acropolis, and the ancient Temple of Athena. You will come across the captains' mansions, built atop it, between the 16th and 18th centuries. In the village centre lives and breathes the Church of the Virgin Mary (Panagia) of Lindos, with its 15th century frescoes. Ascend to the Acropolis of Lindos where lies the Temple of Athena. For centuries, Lindos' city-state was the most important on the island. In Rhodes, you will go through d'Amboise Gate to walk the Street of Knights. You will find the Knights' residences, separated according to order, which bear their corresponding crests.

Cruise to Santorini's Islands and Volcanoes*

3 hours



Admire Palea and Nea Kameni, where underneath lies an active volcano. From the ship, you will be transported to Nea Kameni by small boat. Walk to the heart of the volcano, a unique geological phenomenon, where there is gas-steam activity atop Nea Kameni's crater and beaches are embraced by thermal springs. Next is Palea Kameni with its therapeutic waters. Its sea temperature is 5°C higher than in the rest of the locations and the water contains sulphur. After the volcano, explore Fira in all its splendour. End in Santorini, where you will descend to the Old Port by funicular (ticket included in fee) to reach the cruise ship by boat.

SANTORINI

Catamaran Sunset Tour

Half day



Discover Santorini's beautiful coastline with this delightful catamaran cruise, which includes a BBQ meal with unlimited drinks and snorkelling equipment on board. Enjoy a refreshing swim in the clear blue waters at the Red Beach, and sail past the big lighthouse south of the caldera. Explore secluded volcanic beaches, experience the volcanic hot springs or simply relax on deck. Before the cruise ends, you will stop below Oia and watch the breathtaking sunset!

Roundtrip transfers from/to hotel are included.

Spectacular Oia Village Perched on the Caldera Rim*

3 hours



Head up to the monastery of Prophet Ilyas to enjoy the breathtaking view and pure, Cycladic air. The tour then continues towards the north. To the east, you will see settlements like Kamari and Monolithos, while passing through Fira and the traditional villages of Firostefani and Imerovigli, to eventually arrive to the settlement of Oia. During the route west you will see the lace-like caldera, the little islands of Thirasia, Palea and Nea Kameni and an unsurpassable view. In Oia, take the time to stroll through the marble-paved alleys and become acquainted with the characteristic buildings and Ammoudi at the foot of the caldera.

EXCURSIONS

SANTORINI

Akrotiri Bus Tour – Oia Sunset

Full day



Begin with a guided tour of Akrotiri, one of Greece's most important prehistoric settlements. Then enjoy some free time at the famous Red Beach, renowned for the unique colour of its sand and soaring red lava cliffs, before going to the trendy Perivolos black sand beach and enjoying its many restaurants, tavernas, cafés, beach bars and water sports. Enjoy a walking tour of Megalochori, a beautiful traditional village, then drive to Profitis Ilias Mountain, the island's highest peak (567 m). Finally, learn about the wine-making process, from start to finish, and sample Santo's famous wines. You also have the option to continue to Oia to admire the breathtaking sunset.

Daily except Monday. Entrance fees to the archaeological site and lunch not included.

SYROS

Sublime Syros

Half day



From the UNESCO-listed port of Ermoupoli, head to Anastasi Church and enjoy breathtaking views of Tinos and Mykonos. Pass fishing villages, brightly-painted houses and blue and white churches as you travel to various beach towns. Then, visit the Agia Varvara monastery and stop at a loukoumi factory for a tasting of this treat, also known as Turkish delight. Return to Ermoupoli for a walking tour: see The Dormition of the Virgin Mary by El Greco, the Orthodox churches of Metamorphosis and Agios Nikolaos, Little Venice, Apollon Theatre, Museum of Cycladic Art and Archaeological Museum. Conclude at the lively Plateia Miaouli square.

SYMI

Authentic Symi Feast

Half day



Known as Ymos to the Ancient Greeks, the island is an untouched natural wonderland as well as a protected archaeological site. Sail in traditional "caici" boats from Symi harbour to Nimos, to enjoy a swim in its pristine blue waters and experience a festive beach barbecue. Note that the minimum number of passengers for this excursion is 30, while the maximum number is 60.

TURKEY

Ancient Ephesus Through the Ages – Hellenistic and Roman*

3 hours



In Ancient Ephesus, you will find immortal relics from Hellenistic, Roman and Early Christian eras. Enjoy a guided tour among the Agora, the Odeon, the Library of Celsus, the marble-paved Street of Kouretes, the Baths of Scholastica, Trajan's Fountain, the Public Latrines, the Residences of the Patricians, the Prytaneum, and the Temple of Hadrian. The Great Theatre, built in the 4th century BC, is famous for its acoustics, while excavation finds reside in the Archaeological Museum of Ephesus in the city of Selçuk. End your day by setting off to the Grand Bazaar in Kusadasi. You will be able to stroll as you shop – and bargain – for products and souvenirs.

Reservations

The information on excursions contained in this pamphlet is indicative only. These excursions are available through the Transat representative at the hospitality desk of your hotel or cruise ship. Please ask your representative about the hours of operation. Other excursions than those outlined in this booklet are also available.

Scheduling of excursions

All tours depart from the hotel and/or pier adjacent to the ship's berth. Please note that all passengers should be on board the ship no later than 30 minutes prior to the scheduled sailing time. The scheduling of all shore excursions conforms with this requirement. At the completion of the tour you will be returned to the hotel or pier unless you opt to leave the tour en route. In this case it will be your responsibility to secure transportation back to your hotel or ship, at your own cost, and it is your responsibility to return to the ship on time. The ship's departure cannot be delayed for late-returning passengers. Passengers must be aware that there is a possibility their ship may be unable to berth in inclement weather.
